



LOCAL RULES

- **STONES IN BUNKERS** are movable obstructions – Rule 24-1 Applies
- **CART PATH EXTENSIONS:** Free relief from cart path extensions
- **DISTANCE MEASURING DEVICES**
Players are allowed to use devices that measure distance only. Use of devices that gauge or measure other conditions that might affect a player's play (e.g. wind, gradient, temperature, etc.) is not permitted, regardless of whether any such additional functions are actually used.
- **OUT OF BOUNDS**
Out of bounds is defined by the white stakes and includes the railroad tracks on holes 3, 7, and 17. It is also defined by the parking lot and streets and by white stakes left of hole 17 by the maintenance barn and house.
- **BARN ON 2 AND 10**
If the condition (barn) interferes with the player's lie, stance or intended area of his swing, relief can be taken without penalty as follows:
Relief: Lift and drop within one club-length of and not nearer the hole than the nearest point of relief on a part of the course, which avoids interference by the condition.
Relief is not available if the barn obstructs the "line-of-flight" that the player intends to hit his ball on.
- **LATERAL HAZARD ON 13 & 14**
The wooded area within the boundaries defined by the red stakes on the right of holes 13 & 14 is to be treated as a lateral water hazard. A ball lost in this area is considered to be lost within the hazard. The player may take relief as described in Rule 26-1.
- **GROUND UNDER REPAIR**
All areas deemed to be ground under repair will be properly marked. Unmarked areas of the course are to be treated as "rub of the green" and must be played as it lies.
- **FLOWER BEDS LEFT OF HOLE 1**
"The flower bed left of #1 is ground under repair from which play is prohibited. If a player's ball lies in the area, or if it interferes with the player's stance or the area of his intended swing, the player must take relief under Rule 25-1.
- **ACCIDENTAL MOVEMENT OF A BALL ON A PUTTING GREEN**
When a player's ball lies on the putting green, there is no penalty if the ball or ball-marker is accidentally moved by the player, his partner, his opponent, or any of their caddies or equipment. The moved ball or ball-marker must be replaced as provided in Rules 18-2, 18-3 and 20-1. This Local Rule applies only when the player's ball or ball-marker lies on the putting green and any movement is accidental. Note: If it is determined that a player's ball on the putting green was moved as a result of wind, water or some other natural cause such as the effects of gravity, the ball must be played as it lies from its new location. A ball-marker moved in such circumstances is replaced.
